#### Denison State School Carnival






PBL Positive Behaviour for Learning Be Kind Be Safe Be a L

This fortnight our PBL focus falls in the domain of Being Safe with the key message moving safely around the school and following teacher instructions whilst doing this. For students this means walking and not running, listening to teacher instructions, being quiet and looking in the right direction. The purpose of following these rules when moving around the school is to be safe and to show respect to other students who may be learning or who may be sharing the path as they transition to other classes and to breaks. Listening to teacher instructions and following these instructions is also a way to show respect to the teacher. From a home perspective this could be reinforced by discussing the importance of moving safely and being respectful of others in spaces



that are shared with other people e.g., shopping centres. PBL works best when the whole school community is on board and we thank you for working with us to ensure that your child has the support they need to be successful every day at school.

We'd like to say a big thank you to our wonderful School Crossing Supervisor/s, for everything you do for our students and school community! You do a great job keeping our students and other pedestrians safe as they cross the road in peak drop-off and pick-up times.

Why not say a big thank you the next time you see them on duty! You can also show your appreciation for School Crossing Supervisors by slowing down, following directions and being courteous while travelling in our school zone.

#### Did you know?

- The School Crossing Supervisor Scheme is operated by the Department of Transport and Main Roads.
- There are more than 2000 school crossing supervisors who operate over 1300 crossings at more than 700 Queensland schools.
- There has not been a single fatality on a supervised crossing since the scheme started in 1984.
